Section 4. First aid measures

Description of first aid measures

Section 5. Fire-fighting measures

Extinguishing media

Flammable liquid and vapor. Vapors are heavier than air and can travel along the ground to a source of ignition and flashback. Vapors can spread along the ground and collect in low or confined areas. Closed containers may rupture due to the buildup of pressure when exposed to extreme heat. During emergency conditions overexposure to decomposition products may cause a health hazard. Symptoms may not be immediately apparent or may be delayed. Obtain medical attention.

Precautions for safe handling
